

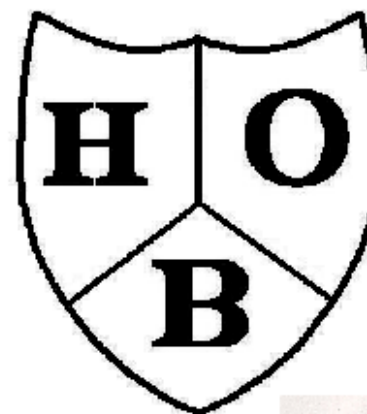
At Hill of Beath Primary School we aim to have a playground where:

Hill of Beath Primary School Playground Charter







All pupils in Hill of Beath playground have the right to:

UN Convention on the Rights of the Child.

-  All children have these rights and no child should be treated unfairly on any basis. (Article 2)
-  Adults should do the best for all children in the playground. (Article 3)
-  To be listened to and give your opinions. (Article 12)
-  To find out things and share what you think. (Article 13)
-  To choose their own friends. (Article 15)
-  To be protected from hurt emotionally and physically. (Article 19)
-  To respect other people. (Article 29)
-  To have their own language and religion. (Article 30)
-  To play and rest. (Article 31)
-  Not to be taken advantage of. (Article 36)
-  Not to be punished in a cruel or harmful way. (Article 37)

The HOBBITS

The Hill of Beath Breaktime Improvement Team are there to:

-  Talk to and listen to you.
-  Help you to play games and to find someone to play with.
-  To try and help sort out problems you may have.
-  We will help you to get an adult to deal with serious problems.

In Hill of Beath Playground we will not tolerate:

-  Kicking, hitting or fighting
-  Teasing or name calling
-  Inappropriate arguing
-  Threatening people
-  Being bossy or being manipulative
-  Spreading rumours and gossiping
-  Invading personal space
-  Spitting or swearing
-  Racism
-  Bullying (Bullying is a complicated and serious issue. If any of the above statements are carried out on a regular repetitive basis by one or more people, this could be viewed as bullying and must be reported to someone. This is always dealt with very seriously).



Remember, HOBBITS and adults are always in the playground to make it a safe and happy place.

The HOBBITS may try to talk through a problem. If it is more serious an adult may give a yellow card which will mean 5 minutes time out. If it is very serious or the people involved do not take their yellow card they will be given a red card and sent in. Mrs Headrick will be informed of this.
